September 20, 2017 Katie Mace, a sophomore at Line Mountain High School, recently attended the Wildlife Leadership Academy for the inaugural PA Gobbler Field School. At this field school, Katie learned how to assess wildlife habitat, firearm safety, leadership skills, effective communication skills, forest ecology, and more from professional staff. She will report on her experiences as part of becoming an outstanding wildlife ambassador.

October 18, 2017 Wayne Laubscher-- The Yucatan Experience: Cenotes, Aves, and Ruinas

Take a brief visit to Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula. Highlighted will be the unusual geology, bird life, and the dramatic ancient human history of the area. Learn about the mysterious cenotes and their connection with the dinosaur extinction and tour a few Mayan ruins. See toucans, motmots, and tropical orioles, to name a few birds, plus experience a dive on an ocean reef.

November 15, 2017 Michael McGuire -- Birds of Sweden

January 18, 2018 Lauri Shaffer : Birds of Texas and Louisiana--a recap of the famous Rio Grande Birding Festival and the Yellow Rails and Rice festival of November 2017

February 15, 2018 Owen Floody: Wet Botswana

This program will describe an April 2017 trip to Botswana. Some of the specific areas visited include the Kalahari Desert, Okavango Delta, Savuti Channel and Chobe River. As this trip coincided with the tail end of the wet season, the vegetation was lush and mammals sometimes difficult to view. Birds, however, were abundant and cooperative, earning them a prominent part in the presentation.

March 15, 2018 Jack McCann and Jill Largent: Wildlife of Yellowstone National Park in summer and winter

April 19, 2018 Margaret C. Brittingham, Ph.D.:Marcellus Shale Exploration and Development in Core Forest Habitat: Effects on Forest Habitat and Birds

North-central Pennsylvania contains one of the largest blocks of core forest within the mid-Atlantic region. These core forests overlay the Marcellus shale where resource extraction has increased exponentially and is projected to continue for at least the next 40 years. Dr. Brittingham will discuss landscape change associated with shale gas development on public and private land within the first 5 years of shale gas development and research on initial response by forest bird communities to these changes. She will also discuss wildlife use of pipelines and potential strategies for reducing negative effects of shale gas development on forest habitat and wildlife.
